

- Read the story below. For each underlined word, write the homophone that fits the sentence. (Homophones are words that sound alike but have different meanings and spellings.)

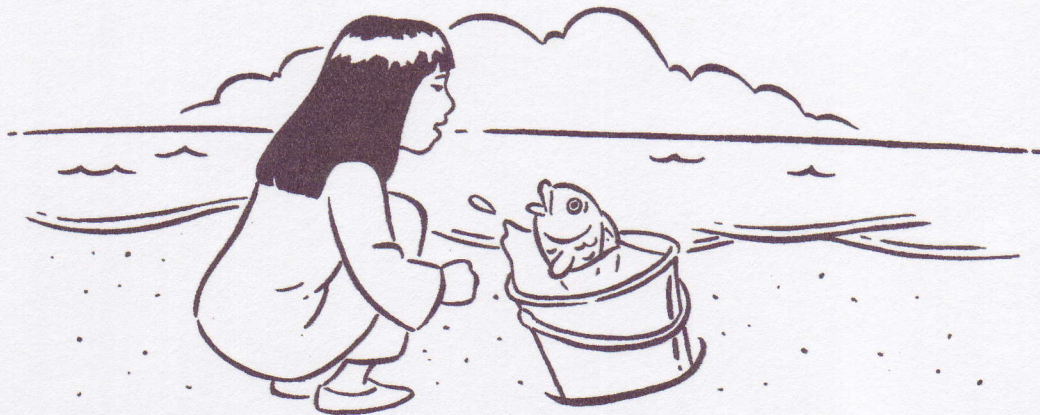
